## City Council Meeting Minutes of August 8, 2016

**PRESENT: MAYOR WALKER, COUNCILORS – AT LARGE LAPOINTE & STEARNS, WARD COUNCILORS DUFOUR, GABRION, LINDLEY, CIRCO, & HARVEY-MCPHERSON**

Mayor Walker called the Council Meeting to order.

### 1. COMMENTS / QUESTIONS FROM THE PUBLIC CONCERNING MATTERS NOT RELATED TO ITEMS ON THE AGENDA:

### 2. OTHER BUSINESS:

Susan Farnsworth, Chair of Hallowell Recycling Committee asked the Council for support of Hallowell's continued participation in the Household Hazardous Waste Day held each spring. The Committee has long supported Hallowell's contribution to the cost of this collection because they believe that proper disposal of household hazardous benefits residents of this region and good for the environment. The committee asks that the Council approve sufficient funding for this program when approving the final FY17 Budget.

Frank O'Hara, self-appointed "Town Nag", encouraged the Council to hold an informational participatory (small group) session about the 6 or 7 design enhancements to the Water Street project this fall. Then the Council will have the public's input when the time comes to make decisions for enhancements to this project.

Michael Hall, executive director of the Augusta Downtown Alliance, a nonprofit organization dedicated to revitalizing downtown Augusta, requests to hang a banner over Water Street for three weeks in November to publicize their fundraiser to be held in early December to benefit the restoration of the Colonial Theatre and Augusta Downtown. Councilors had concerns because merchants and the City of Hallowell celebrate the holidays at this time period. Lapointe – Gabrion move to table this request to hang banner over Water Street from Augusta Downtown Alliance mid-November until December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Mr. Hall will contact HABOT president Ruth Lachance, to see what is being planned in Hallowell. Unanimously approved

Lapointe – Lindley move to grant Douglas Burgfield permission to serve alcohol at a wedding reception September 16, 2016 hiring a local caterer (Liberal Cup) at City Hall. Unanimously approved

5. Elaina George presented an informative report on the Oxford House concept. An Oxford house project is located on 138 Town Farm Road in Hallowell. ( report is on file in the city clerk's office)
6. Karen Tucker, Healthy Communities of the Capital Area gave a presentation about a free initiative designed to be guide in developing an effective workplace wellness and community health program. City manager Nate Rudy suggested the City employees and Hallowell Board of Trade may wish to partner such a program.  
Harvey-McPherson – Lapointe move to refer this discussion of establishing a workplace wellness and community health program to the Health and Welfare Committee. Unanimously approved

Dufour – Harvey-McPerson move to refer to Personnel + Policy Committee for review and recommendation for the Council at the next meeting. Unanimously approved

- 8a. **City Manager's report Item g & h - Lincoln Street property line question regarding Sampson's Row / Paper Street and Lincoln Street property line question regarding driveway access at 19 and 21 Lincoln Street** City Manager Nate Rudy presented the scenario that the cutting & clearing of trees next to the basketball court at Vaughan field was taking place. The CEO was notified. He thought that this is a property line dispute among this property's abutters which includes the City. Joel Johnson, 4 Vine Street, believes that he is paying taxes on a larger piece of property than what his surveyor found. City Manager Rudy recommends getting legal consultation to move the vacated Paper street property out of City's interest and into abutting property owners.  
Dufour –Lindley move to refer this situation to the Property Committee and report back to the Council in October. Unanimously approved

Larry Davis, 123 Town Farm Road arrived late after item 5. and asked for an opportunity to comment on the Oxford-Town Farm house. After a short discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to give time for comments at the September City Council meeting.
